## THE LAMP OF TRUTH - SYNOPSIS

In the height of Sri Lanka's Civil War, more than three hundred thousand innocent civilians were trapped in the war zone. There were only a handful of doctors to treat the thousands of injured civilians.

Dr. Varatharaja, the director of health services of the region, was one of those doctors. The Sri Lankan government ordered all the medical personnel from the warzone to vacate the area.

However, Dr. Varatharajah defied the order of the health ministry saying that he would not leave the region abandoning the thousands of injured civilians. He struggled to treat the patients with the very limited medical supplies. As the war progressed, the hospitals were also came under artillery fire. Risking his own life, he continued to serve the people. Eventually, he too was injured and was taken into military custody.

Instead of taking him to a hospital to be treated, he was taken to an unknown location and threatened. Then he was taken to be executed only to be saved by a last minute call from the military higher ups.

He was taken to Colombo and imprisoned at the crime investigation department. In the prison, he was repeatedly threatened and denied medical care. Finally, he was paraded in-front of the media, and forced to downplay the number of war casualties. Thereafter, he was released with very strict conditions. He was able to get the help of USA embassy, and was able to flee Sri Lanka. After moving to the USA, the doctor struggled with severe PTSD. As an important witness of the war crimes committed in Sri Lanka, he has testified to the United Nations council.

#### DR. T. VARATHARAJAH LEAD ACTOR

Dr. Thurairajah Varatharajah was born in Eastern province of Sri Lanka. He completed his medical studies at the Univesity of Jaffna in 2004. He had his medical training at the Teaching Hospital, Jaffna and worked as a medical officer in several districts in the island nation. He was promoted to become the regional director of health services in the Mullaitivu district in Northern province of Sri Lanka. During this time, the region was sevrely affected by the civil war. The Lamp of Truth is a film based on the true events happened during this time. He currently lives in the USA and work as a medical doctor.

He is one of the official witnesses for the United Nations investigations on war crimes and human rights violations in Sri Lanka




### THANESH GOPAL DIRECTOR



"With Poyyavilakku (The Lamp of Truth), the young writer-director Thanesh Gopal and his energetic team, the experienced cinematographer Kris A Chandar, editor R.G. Anand, and music director Jithin K. Roshan, have deftly rendered on screen the intricate life and times of Dr. Varatharajah, who is a significant witness to the torture and killings of Sri Lankan Tamils, particularly towards the concluding period of the war.

What is remarkable about Thanesh Gopal's debut feature is its ambition of capturing on a modestly budgeted indie film, the epic canvas of the doctor's life, which extends from the US where he presently lives to the backdrop of the war.
